- 21 miles of continuous, multi-use greenway space around Preston
- A real "green" asset for Preston and Lancashire
- Creates a sustainable transport route in and around Preston
- Supports improved health and well being for residents and visitors
- Uses mostly existing paths, tracks and quiet roads
- Easily accessible to all groups
- Route includes some of Preston's best features, including the docks, Savick Brook, Ribble Link Canal, Brockholes Wetland, Boilton Wood, Avenham, Miller Parks and the River Ribble
- A unique opportunity for all to experience and enjoy the local environment
- Supports community led environmental projects, including heritage and arts, events and celebrations
- A major scheme in partnership with Preston City Council
- Opening July 2012



A LASTING LEGACY

The Preston Guild Wheel is a 21 mile "greenway" that encircles Preston, linking the city to the countryside and bringing the benefits of a beautiful outdoor space to the city perimeter.

It has been created as a lasting legacy to celebrate the 2012 Preston Guild and benefit Preston residents and visitors alike for years to come.

The Guild Wheel route makes the most of the different landscapes that surround the city, creating a rich and varied environment for everyone to enjoy.

From the beautiful woodland areas at Red Scar Wood and Boilton Wood in the east, alongside the gently meandering River Ribble to the south of the city and the historic splendour of the docklands area, the Guild Wheel offers something for all.

A partnership project by Preston City Council and Lancashire County Council, the Guild Wheel is set to become a new and lasting Lancashire landmark.
